



The City of Norway Recycle Program

The City of Norway has recently been having some problems with their totally voluntary recycle program. There have been reports of illegal dumping at the collection site. The problems have been with the type of materials dropped off and also where the recycle items are coming from. The containers are monitored at the DPW, and violations are reported to the police department.

This program is for City of Norway residents only. There is a cost associated with the program that is funded by the City of Norway residents. We have a paper collection container and a larger collection bin that accepts, glass, plastic and tin located at the DPW at 400 10th Avenue in Norway.

Paper Collection

The paper collection container is for mixed paper only. By mixed paper we mean any paper product EXCEPT corrugated cardboard. Some examples are: newspapers, magazines, computer paper and thin cardboard like cereal boxes.

In our large recycle collection container located next to the Public Works Department on 10th Avenue, we accept, plastic #1 & #2, glass and tin.



Plastic - #1 (clear/transparent) and #2 (cloudy/opaque)

Plastic includes only #1 (clear/transparent) and #2 (cloudy/opaque) plastic only. Look for the number located inside the recycle emblem on the bottom of items. Please do not include meat trays or containers, motor oil or anti-freeze containers, plastic with the numbers 3-7 and no plastic bags.

Glass

Glass includes clear, brown and green glass bottles and jars. Please don't drop off plates, windows, light bulbs, mirrors, clay pots, glassware or ceramics.

Tin

Tin cans can be bi-metal. No aluminum foil. Please rinse well and remove labels if possible.
